Dear Residents, Families, and Employees;

To date, 189 out of 191 test results from the Indiana mandatory staff testing have come back, the remaining 2 required re-testing. We are pleased to report that all test results have been negative thus far! We take this opportunity to thank all our employees for being so vigilant in taking every precaution possible for the good of the Timbercrest community.

Based on this good news, we can act on new guidelines from the Indiana State Department of Health which will be of great relief for everyone. Contingent on remaining COVID-19 free and infection numbers in Indiana continue to decrease, the following “re-opening” timeline is in place for Timbercrest:

- July 3 The scheduled Outdoor Visitations resume in the various designated areas;
- July 4 With administration’s approval, risk screening for signs and symptoms of respiratory illness and wearing facemasks, families may be permitted to assist with resident moves.
- July 6 Manor residents may leave the campus on their own, including for medical appointments with the necessary precautions of wearing facemasks and performing social distancing.
- July 6 The Residential Beauty Shop reopens for washing and cutting of hair.
- July 9 The Crestwood Beauty Shop reopens for washing and cutting of hair.
- July 17 Indoor Visitation begins for pre-scheduled visits, in designated areas, with evening hours provided.

Neighborhood Home residents may schedule appointments for the Beauty Shop in residential.

The Health Care Beauty Shop will open (pending completion).

Shopping for Neighborhood Home residents by Program and Service staff ends.

You can help assure these opportunities remain available for all residents and their families by keeping in mind that, any of us can be the conduit for bringing COVID-19 into Timbercrest. The use of facemasks in public areas and social distancing is one way to curb the spread of this infection. We thank you for doing your part every day and everywhere.
