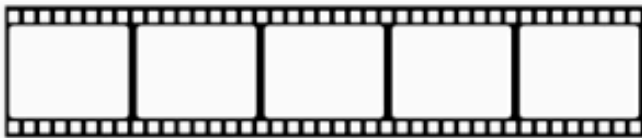
Summer of Art
